OUR HISTORY



Originally, two Episcopal churches were established in our area: St. George's in 1958 and St. Patrick's in 1959. They came together in 1985 to form a new church. We were officially called St. George and St. Patrick's Episcopal Church, but our nickname was "Two Saints."

In 2010, we undertook a new name to reflect the work of God among us: Grace. It was at this time that we moved from a parish to a mission of the Diocese of Texas. We worked hard to grow through a number of efforts including the debut of "yoga mass", outreach and virtual services during the COVID-19 pandemic, professional concerts, and the debut of the Spanish service in 2022. Over time, we became known as a multi-ethnic, intergenerational church with a vibrant music ministry and a thriving day school.

After years of uncertainty about our future, Grace is now a growing congregation. We became an independent parish again in 2022, ringing the bell at the annual Diocesan Council meeting and ushering in a new season of hope. The movement back to a parish status is a rarity and demonstrates the strength of the congregation's desire to move the church forward.

Throughout the history of the church, a constant thread has always been that we are an inclusive, multi-cultural community.

>>> PARISH SCHOOL

Grace Episcopal School is a community of compassionate, curious students where each child is nurtured in a structured, joyful, and secure environment. We celebrate the human spirit and honor the diversity among us while fostering the love of learning, creativity, and wonder. The school has been in operation for over 25 years as a licensed day school.

The school currently has an enrollment of 85 students and employs 20 teachers, of which half are native Spanish speakers. Our school is the only facility in the area that accepts children as young as 6 weeks old.

Our school board of directors is comprised of members of the Vestry, church members, and school parents. The church rector serves as the board chair and is seated on the executive committee along with a vice president, treasurer, and secretary. Monthly board meetings include standing reviews of the school's finances and status of the school and discussion on topics that continue to move the school forward in education and spirituality.





WHAT WE'RE LOOKING FOR

>>> NEW RECTOR PROFILE

We seek a rector who can develop and implement a comprehensive strategy to reach new people and incorporate them into the life of the church. Specifically, we would love to see more families with children and youth involved in our congregation. This might also require us to enlarge or improve the physical facilities of the church as we expand or enhance our ministries.

With those goals, we know we need a rector with strong program planning, stewardship, and management skills. We also want a collaborative leader with gifts for empowering and equipping lay people for ministry. We are in the process of expanding our outreach ministries to provide direct services to those living on the margins of society. Our rector should share that focus. Currently, our outreach committee is working to launch ESL classes, and our language service is growing. Bi-lingual Spanish (Spanish) is preferred but not required.

Our diverse community requires someone with competency and comfort working in a multiracial, multicultural context. We need a rector with the ability to cultivate relationships with multiple generations and backgrounds. We hope to find someone who shares our progressive, adaptable theological perspective.

>>> NEW RECTOR PROFILE - CONTINUED

In addition, we would love for our church to provide more opportunities for Christian education and spiritual formation at every age and stage of life. We also need a decisive leader who can manage both the Church and School while being approachable and collaborative. A rector with a heart for teaching and a strong administrative background would be very helpful as well as having compassion towards staff, children, and parents.

Since hospitality is one of our highest values, we seek someone who models this. Being authentically friendly and engaging with people from all walks of life is essential, as is the ability to communicate in honest and thoughtful ways. Grace would welcome an imaginative spiritual leader who seeks innovation while respecting tradition and embraces technology in a creative way. We commit to helping one another as needed, and we do so with joy, music, and love.

>>> LOCAL SCHOOLS

There are four schools within walking distance of the church:

<u>Shearn Elementary</u> is a public school in the Houston Independent School District serving grades Pre-Kindergarten through 5th grade. The school is a dual-language campus, offering English and Spanish instruction.

<u>Corpus Christi Catholic School</u> is a private school serving grades Pre-Kindergarten 3 through 8th grade. Founded in 1959, the school is accredited by the Texas Catholic Conference of Bishops Education Department.

<u>The Emery/Weiner School</u> is a Jewish private college-preparatory school serving 6th through 12th grade.

<u>Willow Meadows Day School</u> provides daycare services for children 5 months of age - Pre-Kindergarten. The day school is a mission of Willow Meadows Baptist Church and is a member (like our church) of Braes Interfaith Ministry.
