About our Worship

- We use a set service order called a "liturgy." It can be a bit confusing to get the hang of at first, but the order of worship stays (mostly) the same and we share it with all other Episcopal Churches.
- Our worship involves words, music, and movement. Items italicized or listed in red are
 notes about when we stand, sit, and kneel, and what we say and sing together.
 They're called "rubrics," but you can think of them as stage directions. If you aren't sure
 what to do at a given time, don't worry about it! You are welcome to stay seated as
 desired.
- If you desire someone to pray with, our healing prayer ministers will be waiting in the Columbarium Chapel (back right of the sanctuary) during Communion.
- Children are always welcome. Children's Chapel takes place between the Collect and the Peace. Younger children and their caregivers are welcome to sit in our "Pray Ground," located near the back of the sanctuary, as desired.


The Breaking of the Bread

How to Receive Communion:

The ushers will signal when it is time for you to move to the front to receive Communion. If you are not able to process to the altar rail, please let an usher know so that Eucharistic ministers may serve you from your seat.

Holy Communion may be received in the Bread only ("in one kind"), or in both Bread and Wine ("in both kinds"). Wine may be received by dipping the Bread (wafer) slightly into the chalice ("intinction") or by drinking directly from the chalice.

Those not receiving the Sacrament may approach with others, crossing arms across the chest to indicate a desire for the Priest to administer a prayer of blessing.

If you would like to pray with someone, our healing prayer ministers are waiting to pray with you in the Columbarium Chapel (back right of the sanctuary).
